The treatment of anxiety disorders in a primary care setting can be complicated by several factors. A common challenge is the patient who is a known alcohol "drinker" that presents with complaints of anxiety or anxiety related symptoms. A busy office practice with multiple demands adds to the challenge of managing such cases. This workshop will thus focus on practical tips to managing this comorbid problem in your busy practice. Key elements to the workshop will be:

- Interview questions with the greatest yield in disentangling the relationship between the alcohol consumption and anxiety symptoms.
- Useful lab tests in suspected alcohol abuse.
- Using your Cumulative Patient Profile in identifying undisclosed alcohol misuse.
- Treatment protocol for comorbid alcohol and anxiety disorders broken down by visit.
